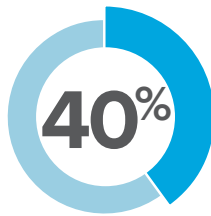


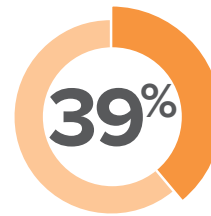

The changing health care landscape creates challenges for businesses and workers

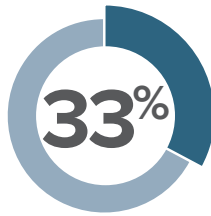

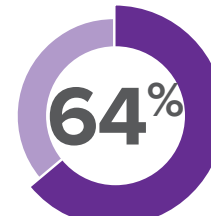
of employers stated health care reform as the most important political issue for their company
